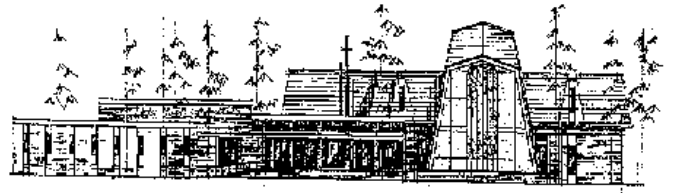

Greetings from Pastor Sam...

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Several of our households regularly use the wonderful prayer book series entitled “For All the Saints” (published by American Lutheran Publicity Bureau www.alpb.org). Each of the four books cover the two-year Daily Lectionary found in the front of the Lutheran Book of Worship. Along with three daily readings and two prayers, there is always an anthology reading from some person of faith throughout the 2,000 years of Christianity. Recently, Laura and I found the following closing prayer quite moving. Others also have commented on how appropriate it seemed to be for all the generations in the Church on earth:

“Lord, you know better than I know myself that I am growing older, and will some day be old. Keep me from getting talkative, and particularly from the fatal habit of thinking that I must say something on every subject and on every occasion.”

“Release me from craving to straighten out everybody’s affairs. Keep my mind from the recital of endless details – give me wings to come to the point.”

“I ask for grace enough to listen to the tales of others’ pains. But seal my lips on my own aches and pains – they are increasing, and my love of rehearsing them is becoming sweeter as the years go by. Help me to endure them with patience.”

“I dare not ask for improved memory, but for a growing humility and a lessening cocksureness when my memory seems to clash with the memories of others. Teach me the glorious lesson that occasionally it is possible that I may be mistaken.”

“Keep me reasonably sweet, I do not want to be a saint – some of them are so hard to live with – but a sour old woman is one of the crowning works of the devil.”

“Give me the ability to see good things in unexpected places, and talents in unexpected people. And give me, O Lord, the grace to tell them so.”

“Make me thoughtful—but not moody: helpful, but not bossy. With my vast store of wisdom it seems a pity not to use it all, but thou knowest Lord, that I want a few friends at the end. Amen” [attributed to a Mother Superior of the 17th Century].


As we celebrate the 493rd anniversary of the Lutheran Reformation, it is good to remember that the real reformation of the Church happens daily as the old Adam or Eve is drowned again in the waters of Holy Baptism by confession and repentance. It seems to me that the anonymous Mother Superior understood that better than most.

Ask the Holy Spirit to bring reformation to your heart and mind so that you will pray daily, worship weekly, study the Bible, have Christian friendships, serve at and beyond St. Matthew’s, and give generously of time, talent, and treasure!

Check out the Crossways Bible study or Monday nights at 6 or Conversations on Mondays at noon. You’re invited to join my Sunday school class on Lutheranism: catholic and evangelical. We’re studying the creeds this fall and the Augsburg Confession in the spring. You know all the other influences that lobby for your heart and mind daily. How about some disciplined study of Scripture and foundational Christian confessions of faith?

I hope you’ll attend Pr. Carl Voges’ seminar on “Martin Luther’s Marks of the Church” on Saturday, October 30th. We begin with sung Morning Prayer at 8:30 a.m. and continue with the seminar from 9am-12:30pm. Cost is \$10 per person and covers the seminar expenses. From St. Matthew's Healing Committee...

Saint Matthew's Healing Committee (Bill Davis, Alan Hunsberger, Jenna Ricketts, Saville Riesz, Ruth Smith, and Helen Stansbury) is continuing to develop our recommendations for moving Saint Matthew's forward in love. We wish to thank all of you who have given us your input. We hope to complete our work in December, so you still have time to give us additional written ideas and suggested solutions.

The committee has made some initial recommendations to the church council as to how they can improve communications between the council and the congregation. Our complete recommendation letter is in our minutes from August 18th, but in summary we recommended that:

1. The council should publish monthly minutes that are timely and complete and that contain details of their meetings.
2. Each month, the council should publish an article in the Encounter that discusses the important issues that they have handled and the decisions they have made.
3. The council should regularly provide a bulletin insert with information for the congregation.
4. The council should communicate its vision for the various ministries of St. Matthew's through Temple Talks and publications.
5. The committee believes that the recent cash flow statement from the treasurer was a good start to sharing financial information with the congregation. We believe that the report needs to be monthly, needs to include information on the "Cash In" side similar to the "Cash Out" side including totals for designated contributions to the special funds and to the ministry teams, and needs to show the cash balances in the various church accounts.
6. No Giving Statements have been sent to the congregation this year, but the committee understands that they are being prepared. We recommend that these be sent out to the congregation at least every other month for the rest of this year and that they be sent out at least quarterly in 2011.

All of the committee members appreciate your continued prayers and support.

Stephen Ministry News— Receptivity to Care—Part II

Last month we closed Part I of this article on Receptivity to Care with a quote from St. Matthew’s Gospel, repeated here. ***Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Matthew 11:28.*** Keep this quote in mind when you think about Stephen Ministry and Stephen Ministers, since sometimes Stephen Ministers are the ones who “deliver” Christ’s care to those suffering in the moment.

It is most difficult for people to ask for help. Whether it is because of guilt, shame, inadequacy, or fear of rejection, many would much prefer to suffer alone than ask for help.

But suffering alone is not God’s intent for us. Jesus promises to help the weary—just as St. Matthew wrote. We can receive this promised rest when we turn to one another for comfort and help.

Our Stephen Ministers know all about receiving care. Many of them have been on the receiving end of care at an earlier point in their lives—something that has motivated them to give care now. They know how difficult it is to ask for help, but they also know that great personal and spiritual growth and healing that follow. They know how to respond in a loving, caring, and nonjudgmental manner. They are equipped, ready and waiting to provide the comfort and care God very much desires you to have.

If you find yourself now or in the future facing difficulties in life, don’t succumb to society’s norm of remaining strong and suffering alone. Take the courageous step of seeking help. Open your heart to receiving God’s love and grace through another person. Our Stephen Ministry offers the opportunity for a very confidential relationship with someone who will listen to you and provide you with the care and encouragement you need, while Christ works inside to bring rest to your weary, burdened heart.

Chaperones are still needed for the high school lock-in as well as the confirmation retreat, or they will need to be cancelled.

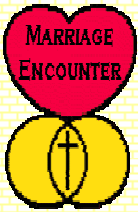
